



Responsible Adult

20 Hour Child Care Training Course



This course meets the requirements of 20 hours training to become a "Responsible Adult" as stipulated by Child Care Licensing Regulations. The content covers child development, guiding behaviour, health, safety, nutrition and programming. The course is live and interactive, so participants must have video and audio capabilities, as well as participate and attend all sessions in order to receive the certification at the end of the course.

To sign up for this course participants must:

- Be 19 years of age
- Have minimum Grade 8 English written and oral skills
- Attend all scheduled sessions

Once the training is complete, participants are eligible to work as a Responsible Adult in:

- School-age Child Care Programs
- Licensed Family Child Care
- Registered License-Not-Required Child Care
- As additional support or substitute in Licensed Preschool and Licensed Child Care Programs
- Summer Camps

METIS CULTURAL BIN

Aansaamb aen kiskayhtaamaahk – Learning Together" (Heritage Michif, translated by Norman Fleury) is a professional learning guide, resource kit and three professional development workshops intended to support early learning and child care professionals to integrate Métis content in early years programming. The six-hour workshops

provide additional opportunities to support incorporating Métis specific teachings within early learning programming, promoting learning environments in which Métis culture is recognized and celebrated.

Presenter: Erica Henderson (Metis Nation BC)

Erica Henderson has spent the past 30 years working in the Early Years field. During that time she has owned and operated her own licensed Child Care Facility, worked with Families through the Pregnancy Outreach Program, was a Child Care Resource and Referral Coordinator and Early Years Program and Services Manager for a non-profit. Erica has extensive experience facilitating parenting programs, Early Years Educator workshops and supporting families through the Early Years. Erica works for Métis Nation BC, within the Ministry of Education as a Child Care Navigation and Support Coordinator. She is a mother of 2 two grown children and lives in the South Cariboo on the traditional lands of the Secwepemc Peoples where she enjoys spending time with her family hiking, fishing and camping.

LIVING WITH BEARS – BEARS AWARENESS

Living in beautiful Northern British Columbia, we see our fair share of bears! What do we should a bear approach us or children playing in a playground? Through this workshop, we will tackle this question and more.

Hilary Desmarais is a Conservation Officer situated in Mackenzie, BC. Her job encompasses a wide range of duties, from natural resource law enforcement to managing human/wildlife conflict. Part of managing human/wildlife conflicts includes preventing the conflict in the first place through education and enforcement. The goal of the Conservation Officer Service is to proactively prevent these interactions before wildlife becomes a risk to public safety. Proactive management includes providing education around animal behaviour, including what kind of behaviours indicate aggression, and requiring people to manage attractants, such as garbage and fruit trees, to prevent wildlife from being in close proximity to people.

Beverly has traveled across the province promoting Culture to Schools, Provincial & Federal Government, Institutions, Metis Communities Cultural Festivals and Olympic VANOC & FHFN Cultural Pavilion.

She believes that culture is an educational experience and includes four components of learning; physiological, emotional, physical and spiritual. She demonstrates that the traditional ways of Métis people, through laughter and fun, can heal the heart. Her belief is that this experience will provide purpose and meaning and will help us to realize all inner potentials and enhance self-esteem.




Krystel is Nisga'a and Wet'su'weten and carries her mother's crest of the White Grizzly.

She is a mother of a 22-year-old young man who has Cerebral Palsy, and she is a well-known advocate for the Special Needs Community. With her own unique experiences and obstacles in life, she offers an inspiring story and is here to bring tools of knowledge on how to relieve our body of the energies we hold that cause us to be physically ill and mentally exhausted.
